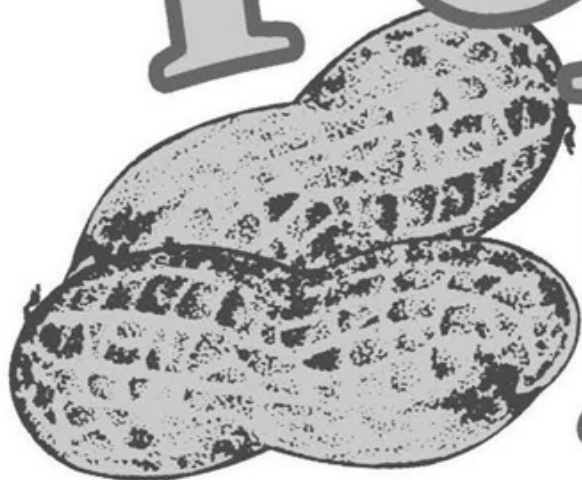

Emergency/Disaster Relief

- **Immediately respond to natural disasters in peanut-producing states by supplying peanut butter and peanut products**
- **Respond to requests from local peanut growers or grower organizations for assistance in obtaining peanut products for individual state efforts during natural disasters**



Peanut Proud Humanitarian Efforts

Domestic Hunger Relief

- **Partner with state grower organizations to supply peanut butter to Food Banks in peanut-producing states**
- **Respond to requests to address hunger in the U.S. by providing peanuts and peanut butter to school programs and projects in low income rural areas**

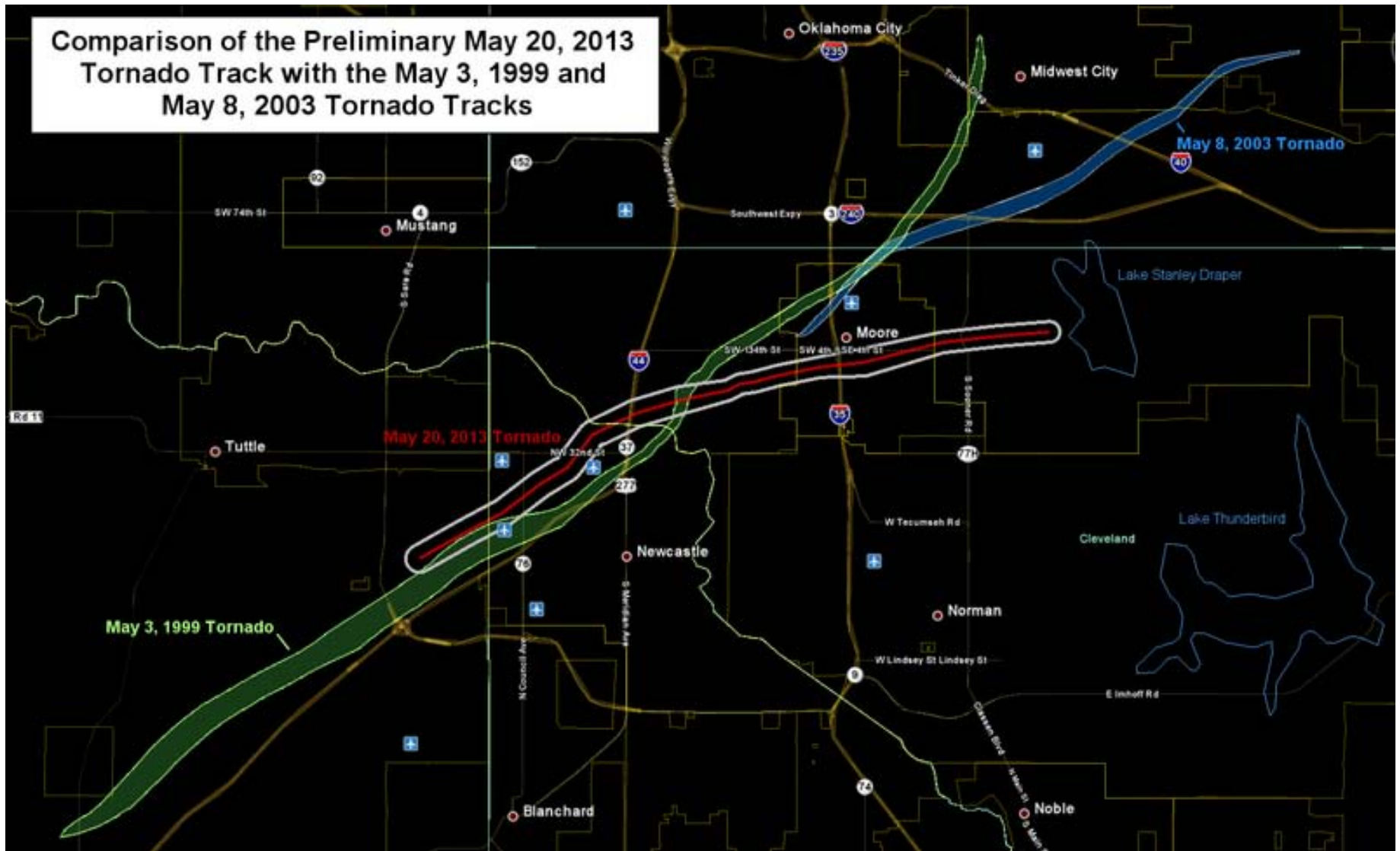

May 20, 2013 Disaster Strikes Oklahoma



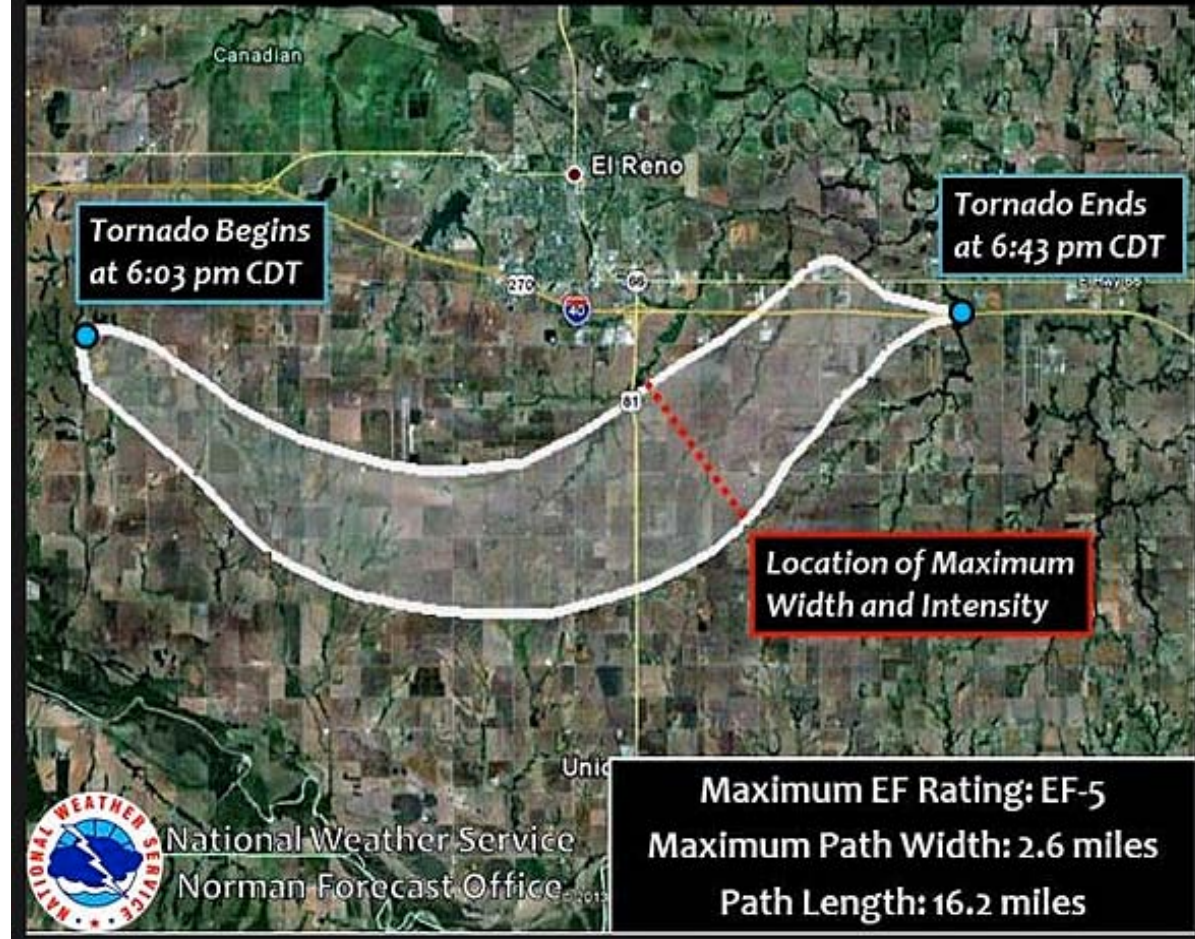
**Comparison of the Preliminary May 20, 2013
